# Trustees' Annual Report, year ended 31st December 2024

### Structure, Governance and Management

#### **Governing Document:**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

## Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees:

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the Elders of the Church and a number of non-ordained members of the congregation. In both cases they are chosen from those members of the congregation who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

#### **Organisational Structure:**

The Kirk Session which meets ten times a year is responsible for spiritual matters within the church and the financial management of its affairs. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee, Social Committee and the Property Committe as appropriate.

#### Objectives and Activities:

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. Busby Parish Church follows an established pattern of worship and fellowship.

# Trustees' Annual Report, year ended 31st December 2024 (Continued)

#### **Achievements and Performance:**

Throughout 2024 our church has continued to be a significant asset for the Busby village community and our wider Parish bounds, and much consideration has been given to how this can be sustained in the future and in the context of the Glasgow Presbytery Mission Plan. Sunday worship remains at the centre of our activities and the average number of attendees has been sustained at c40-50 adults supplemented by the presence of children and teachers/parents from our Sunday Club who attend part of our service before retiring to the hall. Their presence during worship is particularly encouraging and further benefits from our choir mistress joining them in the hall for a time of teaching through music and singing. Notwithstanding this, we believe that there is potential to increase the number of attendees at Sunday worship and for 2025 have retained an ongoing target of increasing average attendance by 20%, half of whom would be aged under 40. After worship fellowship, with teas and coffees served each Sunday following the morning service, continues to be popular and has been embraced warmly by many of those who attended the earlier worship.

Hall use continued to be popular with Keep-Fit, Drop-In, Guild, Brownies and Guides all taking place, along with the established lets associated with art classes, quilting and badminton group. The youth activities are particularly popular with Brownies, Guides and Boys Brigade thriving; to which has been added the Rainbows from September 2024. The East Renfrewshire Foodbank continued to operate a satellite of this initiative throughout the year, providing 396 standard food parcels, as well as 84 personal care parcels and the same number of fresh food parcels, to our 'guests'. All of our leaders and volunteers continue to demonstrate a commendable commitment. All of this is under-pinned by our Church Officer, Mr John Meek, who continues in this role with great dignity and enthusiasm.

A 'Busby Arts Festival' of events was hosted by the Church over the weekend of September 6-8 with funding provided from the 'Busby Village Community Fund'. Like the 'Coronation Weekend' in 2023 this was a notable success demonstrating what can be achieved when partner organisations pull together. We plan to repeat the festival in 2025. In a similar vein, our Drama Group brought to the Community 'Supper and Song' over 3 nights in January 2024 and prepared a similar production for January 2025. It is hoped that further community events will be possible in 2025 and we continue to investigate the potential for a community café 'hub', for which we are aiming to work with outside agencies to provide more community services within the Church buildings. We also want to capitalise on our 190th Anniversary by using it to elevate the prominence of Church and all the activities and services it provides within the village.

With regard to the Presbytery Mission Planning agenda, again little headway was made in 2024 in relation to our working with Greenbank and Netherlee & Stamperland congregations to establish what this means for the future of our ministry and buildings, however some conversations did take place concerning potential joint activities that could serve to bring the congregations closer together. With regard to the proposed union between Busby and Greenbank we believe that the optimum approach to ultimately uniting with Greenbank would be via an initial linkage, although we recognise that none of the other parties concerned have accepted that. Moreover postponing any thoughts of closing any buildings by 2027 must be upper-most in the considerations of all concerned if the aims referred to in the previous paragraph are to be realised. These aims were shared with Presbytery representatives and those from Greenbank to our 'Local Church Review' in November 2024, forming part of our plan for mission going forward and we hope for a positive report from the LRC committee.

In conclusion, our constitution encourages involvement of the congregation and our friends in the wider community to contribute to the life of the Church and we encourage you to get involved. Ongoing attention to all of this will be essential if we are to be successful in strengthening God's Kingdom in our community through our presence as a welcoming place of Worship and Fellowship.

# Trustees' Annual Report, year ended 31st December 2024 (continued)

#### Financial Review:

Total receipts for 2024 of £106,021 and payments of £107,709 resulted in a disappointing deficit for the year of £1,688. Whilst receipts grew by 11%, payments also grew by 14%, driven in large part by an extraordinary 130% increase in heating & lighting costs. These alone at £8,515 accounted for 64% of the overall increase in payments. Thus the Trustees aim for income in 2024 to exceed expenditure by 10% was well and truly scuppered.

In the face of this, a review of charges for hall lets was undertaken and increases will be applied to all external users in 2025. That said our rates remain very competitive in the local area and it is hoped that the number of lets, either one-off or ongoing, will also increase; a renewed emphasis on this has been introduced.

It should not be overlooked that the increase in income of £10,573 benefited from a legacy of £5,000 from the estate of the late Helen Jarvie and a generous, additional gift-aided donation of £5,000 from one of our members. Excluding these the 'Analysis of Donations' at Note 3, shows a decrease, year-on-year, of £1,361, equivalent to 2%. This need not suggest that the appeal to members to review and increase their offerings wemt unheeded as several members increased their gift aid standing orders and we will look for further progress in that regard during 2025.

Expenditure of £5,426 on fabric was similar to 2023 and we can expect a similar level of annual expenditure going forward as we aim to maintain our buildings in the best possible order affordable. This is particularly challenging as regards the Manse as it is recognised that significant improvements would almost certainly be undertaken by any future new owners. Regrettably our approaches to Presbytery and 121 George Street for loans to address these issues, in the short-term, have to date been unsuccessful.

#### Reserves Policy:

It is the Trustees' policy to maintain reserves at the highest possible level and call on these to meet emergency shortfalls in either Ordinary Funds or the Fabric Fund. Wherever possible reserve funds are replenished by fund raising aimed at specific projects. At the end of the year the Church held £20,016 of unrestricted funds between the General Reserve Fund and the Designated Fabric Fund, of which £5,000 has been budgeted for fabric fund investments in 2025.

#### Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities:

The Trustees must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2016. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

# Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Busby Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023 which are set out on pages 6 to 11

## Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

#### Basis of independent examiner's statement

McIntosh This is a fund formed from the legacy of Ronald B. McIntosh that releases a fixed sum of £5,000 per annum to the benefit of our Youth Organisations and General Purposes in

#### **Purpose of Unrestricted Funds**

Fabric Fund This is a fund set aside by the Trustees for the maintenance of Church property.

General This is a fund set aside by the Trustees for the future funding of church activities. Reserve Fund

General Fund This is a fund used to record Ordinary Income & Expenditure; any annual surplus or deficit is transferred to the General Reserve Fund.

Organisations These are funds managed by church organisations to support their individual purpose.

'Funds Donations made to the main Church account and/or between organisations are shown as Transfers.

## Purpose of Endowment Funds

Anderson & Mather Trust

This is a trust fund executed on behalf of the Mather Family in 1953 and 1966 that provides annual investment income used in meeting the ordinary activities of the church. Year end balances are based on market value of the investment portfolio.

Details of the trust are shown in Appendix A to this report. Whilst the Trustees are designated members of Busby Parish Church the assets remain with the Trust and so are not shown in these main accounts.

## 5 Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employers' contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund.
